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Kapolei Lofts:

Forest City breaks ground on new rental community

t was no ordinary groundbreaking. When Forest City Hawai'i officials and invited dignitaries, including Governor David Ige, took o'o sticks to the ground on January 16, 2015, it marked two firsts — the start of construction on O'ahu's first significant rental housing complex since the 1970s, and the introduction of the first rental community to the urban center of the City of Kapolei.

Kapolei Lofts is a master-planned complex of 499 rental homes on

17 acres at the corner of Kapolei Parkway and Wakea Street, just across the street from the new Foodland and near numerous other community food and retail establishments.

"We're building brand new homes exclusively for renters that will offer first-rate amenities in a beautiful and well-maintained community," said Jon Wallenstrom, president of Forest City Hawai'i. "Kapolei Lofts will be convenient for shopping and dining, and will also provide generous open space and a highly landscaped park where residents and their families can relax and play. The community will be designed with amenities typically found only in our most exclusive communities."

Its amenities include a community center with a resort-style swimming pool, a barbecue area, a 2,000-square-

foot fitness facility; cyber café with wifi; large private room for meetings and private parties; and a great room with large-screen TV.

The rental homes are contemporary in design, with a host of features including central air conditioning, nine-foot-ceilings, walk-in closets, lanais spacious enough for outdoor dining, and energy efficient technology and appliances, and photovoltaic systems. The rental apartments will come in 25 different home designs, ranging from 400-square-foot one-bedroom units to 1,200-square-foot three-bedroom units.

The \$140-million project is being financed via a public-private partnership, including a significant role by Kapolei Properties LLC (KP) through an agreement that allows Forest City to use the land's value towards project financing. KP is also providing funding for project improvements. In addition to several financial institutions, both the State of Hawai'i and the City and County of Honolulu are public partners in this venture.

In his recent State of the State address, Governor Ige cited Kapolei Lofts as a good example of how low-cost government investment tools can be used to create affordable home for working families. Three hundred of the 499 homes will be affordable. Wallenstrom said, "Bringing Kapolei Lofts and this new style of residential rental living to Hawai'i has been a collaborative effort by our financiers and we greatly appreciate their support of the vision."

Pre-leasing for occupancy will begin this summer, with the first rental homes scheduled to be ready for its first renters in the fall.


